Preamble

may incorporate modern technology, including blockchain and digital contracts and digital password-protected online resources ensuring transparency, security, and efficiency. These technological tools are not ends in themselves but means to foster trust, accessibility, communications, and engagement within our community.

As we embark on this journey together, let this agreement serve as a beacon of hope, a guidepost for action, and a contract for mutual community service. It is a living document, evolving as we evolve, adapting as we learn, and growing as we grow. GLOSSARY:

Active Member

An individual or entity with an active membership under the Voluntaria Emergency & Retreat Access Membership Contract, meeting all eligibility requirements and current on dues or fees.

Annual Access Rights

The entitlement of active members to a one-week stay on community property annually, including limited access to shared resources and participation in community activities.

Arbitration

A method of dispute resolution involving an impartial third party (or parties) to make a binding decision on conflicts arising under this contract.

Blockchain Integration

The use of blockchain technology, such as Ethereum, for managing membership contracts, including the issuance of Non-Fungible Tokens (NFTs) to represent membership rights digitally.

Community Resources

Physical, digital, and organizational assets of the Voluntaria Community, including land, facilities, knowledge systems, and tools shared among members.

Consensus Group

A governance body within the Voluntaria Community, composed of members tasked with making decisions through a consent-based process.

Contract Activation

The process by which specific clauses of the membership contract, particularly emergency provisions, are enacted under predefined or consensus-approved conditions.

Emergency Response Coordinator

A designated individual within the Voluntaria Community responsible for managing communications, logistics, and support during emergencies, including responding to member inquiries within 24 hours.

Emergency Scenarios

Predefined or consensus-recognized events triggering the contract's emergency provisions. Examples include natural disasters, geopolitical crises, or economic collapse.

Feedback and Evolution

The iterative process of incorporating member feedback to adapt and improve the terms and operational aspects of the membership contract.

Harmonious Resource Sharing

A principle ensuring equitable and balanced use of community resources by temporary and permanent residents.

Living Document

A contract designed to evolve and adapt over time based on member feedback, legal considerations, and operational needs.

Membership Cap

The intentional limitation of the total number of active memberships to promote meaningful social connections and sustainable resource use.

Membership Contract

The formal agreement between an individual and the Voluntaria Community outlining rights, responsibilities, and terms of engagement.

Membership Token (NFT)

A Non-Fungible Token representing a digital record of a member's rights under the contract, encoded with details such as membership series and unique identification numbers.

Mutual Aid

The foundational principle of the Voluntaria Community, emphasizing voluntary cooperation, support, and shared responsibility among members.

Natural Law

The philosophical basis of the Voluntaria Community, asserting that actions should be guided by ethical principles and non-aggression rather than coercion.

Non-Fungible Token (NFT)

A unique, blockchain-based digital asset used to represent individual memberships securely and verifiably.

Personal Preparedness

The expectation that members take proactive steps to ready themselves for potential emergencies, such as participating in community drills or maintaining up-to-date contact information.

Proposal Submission Privilege

A benefit allowing members to submit formal suggestions or changes for consideration by the Voluntaria Consensus Group.

Regional Activation

The targeted application of emergency provisions based on the geographic location of an emergency and the affected members.

Refund Policy

The terms under which members may receive financial compensation in the event of community dissolution, calculated on a pro-rata basis.

Sanctuary

The provision of physical refuge, support, and solidarity for members on community property during designated times or emergencies.

Voluntaria Community

The collective of individuals, properties, and governance structures that embody the principles of voluntaryism, mutual aid, and preparedness outlined in this contract.

Section 1: Membership Limits

In the realm of the Voluntaria Community, where the principles of mindfulness and strategic foresight reign, we introduce the unique structure of The Voluntaria Emergency & Retreat Access

Membership Contract. This section delineates the foundational aspects of membership, crafted with a deep understanding of social dynamics and the value of personalized connection.

1.1 Limited Membership: A Reflection of Dunbar's Number

- **Embracing Human Connection:** Inspired by Dunbar's Number, which posits a limit to the number of stable social relationships one can maintain, this membership is intentionally capped at three hundred (300) members. This range is not arbitrary; it is a thoughtful reflection of our commitment to fostering genuine, meaningful connections within our community and available land resources.
- **Cohesion and Manageability:** By limiting membership, we ensure that each member of our community is more than just a number. They are recognized, valued, and an integral part of a cohesive network, where every individual's presence is acknowledged and cherished.

1.2 A Living System: Dynamic and Responsive

- Adaptability in Numbers: While we start with a set range, our membership limits are not set in stone. It is a living system, capable of adapting to the evolving needs and size of our community. This adaptability ensures that our community contract remains relevant, effective, and aligned with our community's growth.
- Feedback and Evolution: The structure of our membership limits are open to feedback from our community members. We believe in evolution driven by collective wisdom, ensuring that our community contract remains a true reflection of the needs and aspirations of those it serves.

1.3 Eligibility to Enter into a Contract

Membership is available only to individuals:

- 1. At least 18 years of age.
- 2. Who have the legal capacity to enter into binding contracts under applicable laws.

Section 2: Annual Access Rights

In the heart of the Voluntaria Community, where the principles of mutual aid and shared responsibility flourish, we present the privileges and provisions of our The Voluntaria Emergency & Retreat Access Membership Contract annual land-access rights. This section is a testament to our belief in the power of sanctuary and the importance of a safe haven in times of need.

2.1 The Privilege of Sanctuary: One Week of Refuge

- Annual Respite: Each active contract member is entitled to a one-week stay within the nurturing embrace of the Voluntaria Community's land resources each year. This period is not merely a time away; it's a chance to reconnect, rejuvenate, and reengage with a community that stands as a pillar of strength and solidarity.
- Sanctuary in Times of Calm and Crisis: Whether in times of tranquility or turbulence, this annual access is a reminder of the community's unwavering support and the enduring bond among its members.

2.2 Access to Community Resources: Shared with Care

- Harmonious Resource Sharing: During their stay, members will have limited & monitored access to the community's resources. This access is designed to be harmonious with the community's rhythms, ensuring that the needs of both temporary and permanent residents are met with balance and empathy.
- Mindful Utilization: The use of community resources and participation in activities is imbued
 with a spirit of mindfulness. Members are encouraged to engage with the community's
 offerings in a way that respects the collective ethos and contributes positively to the
 communal tapestry.

2.3 A Commitment to Collective Well-being

- Beyond Physical Space: The annual access right extends beyond the physical space of the community. It is an invitation to be part of a collective journey, to share in the joys and challenges, and to contribute to the community's ongoing narrative.
- Expectations of Engagement: While the community provides a haven, it also thrives on the active engagement of its members. Members are encouraged to participate, share their skills, and add to the community's vibrancy during their stay.

2.4 Obligations During Annual Access

Defining Timelines and Responsibilities

- "Timely response" is defined as a response within 24 hours via official communication channels.
- "Harmonious resource use" means adhering to community-established limits for resources such as water, food, and accommodation during stays.

Clear Member Obligations

Community Obligations:

- Ensure safe, clean, and functional facilities for members during their stay.
- Facilities include tent, designated vehicle parking, and community kitchen.
- Provide access to agreed-upon shared resources, such as accommodations, utilities including electricity and water, and communal spaces, within sustainable limits.
- Offer guidance or support for participating in community activities or contributing skills during the stay.

Member Obligations:

- Respect community rules, norms, and the rights of permanent residents.
- Use resources responsibly and report any damages or malfunctions promptly.
- Contribute to the community through skills, labor, and/or other agreed-upon means as a gesture of reciprocity.
- Provide written notice of their intent to use annual access rights at least 14 days in advance.
- Follow all posted rules and contribute positively during their stay.
- $_{\bullet}$ Report damages or emergencies promptly to designated coordinators.

Section 3: Blockchain Integration and Initial Digital Contract Issuance

3.1 Initial Membership Contract Execution: Digital Countersigned Documents

- Foundation in Digital: Initially, our policies will be issued as digital documents, such as PDFs, featuring secure digital signatures. This method ensures immediate, accessible, and verifiable delivery to our membership.
- Ease and Accessibility: By starting with digital documents, we provide our members with an easily understandable and familiar format, ensuring that everyone, regardless of their technical expertise, can engage with their membership without barriers.

3.2 Transition to Ethereum Blockchain and NFTs

- Claiming Your Digital Token: Once developed, these NFTs will be made available for members to claim. Each NFT will symbolize the contract in a digital, blockchain-based format, offering enhanced security and verifiability.

3.3 NFT Features and Benefits

- Unique Contract Representation: Each NFT will encode crucial details such as the contract series and unique identification number, ensuring that every contract is distinct and securely tied to its holder.
- Linking to Original Policies: The NFTs will serve as digital representations, linking back to the original digital contract documents for full terms and conditions, thereby maintaining continuity and clarity.

3.4 Seamless Integration and User Support

- Integrating Technologies: As we transition from digital documents to NFTs, our focus will be
 on seamless integration, ensuring that membership experience a smooth transition with no
 disruption to their contract management.
- Guidance and Education: We are committed to providing comprehensive support and educational resources to assist our membership in understanding and navigating this new blockchain-based system.

3.5 Disclaimer and Risk Mitigation

• Inherent Risks of Blockchain Systems:

- The use of blockchain and Non-Fungible Tokens (NFTs) involves inherent risks, including but not limited to:
 - **Market Volatility**: Fluctuations in blockchain network costs (e.g., gas fees) and potential market changes may impact the usability or transfer of NFTs.
 - Loss of Access: Members are responsible for maintaining secure access to their digital wallets. The Voluntaria Community cannot guarantee recovery of lost or inaccessible NFTs.
 - **Legal Uncertainty**: Blockchain regulations vary by jurisdiction and may evolve, potentially impacting the enforceability or use of NFTs.
 - **Technological Risks**: Blockchain technology is subject to technical limitations or failures, such as network outages or obsolescence.

• Continuity of Rights:

The transition to blockchain-based systems (e.g., issuance of NFTs) will not compromise
members' rights or access under this contract. In the event of technical or legal issues
rendering blockchain-based systems non-viable, digital or physical alternatives will be
provided to ensure continuity.

Member Responsibilities:

• Members must secure their blockchain wallets and private keys. The Voluntaria Community assumes no liability for lost or compromised wallets or NFTs.

3.6 Data Privacy Policy

 Member data will be collected, stored, and processed in compliance with applicable data privacy laws. • Blockchain records, by design, are publicly accessible, and members accept the inherent risks of this transparency.

3.7 Member Responsibilities

• Members are responsible for safeguarding their personal data and digital wallet information, particularly private keys for blockchain integrations.

Section 4: Community Expectations and Contributions

In the collaborative spirit of the Voluntaria Community, where each member's contribution weaves into the larger tapestry of our collective existence, we present Section 4 of the The Voluntaria Emergency & Retreat Access Membership Contract. This section is dedicated to outlining the roles, responsibilities, and contributions expected from our membership, reflecting our core values of mutual support and shared responsibility.

4.1 The Essence of Community Participation

- Active Engagement: We envision a community where each member is not just a passive
 participant but an active contributor. Whether it's through sharing skills, participating in

- **Diversity in Contribution:** Recognizing the diverse talents and abilities within our community, contributions are not one-size-fits-all. We value the variety of ways in which members can contribute, be it through physical labor, intellectual input, artistic expression, or emotional support.

4.2 Responsibilities in Times of Crisis

• Collective Response to Emergencies: In alignment with the purpose of The Voluntaria Emergency & Retreat Access Membership Contract, during emergencies, members are expected & encouraged to collaborate and work together towards ensuring the safety and well-being of the community. This may involve participating in organized response efforts, sharing resources, or providing support to fellow members.

• **Preparedness and Proactivity:** We encourage membership to be personally prepared for potential emergencies, fostering a culture of proactivity and foresight. This includes staying informed, participating in community drills or preparedness workshops, and being ready to act when the need arises.

4.3 Building a Supportive Environment

- Empathy and Understanding: Central to our community ethos is the cultivation of an environment of empathy and understanding. We strive to create a space where members feel supported, heard, and valued, fostering strong bonds and a sense of belonging.
- Conflict Resolution and Harmony: In a community of diverse individuals, disagreements may arise. We commit to resolving conflicts through open communication, mutual respect, and a focus on harmonious coexistence. Any intra-member disputes will 1st attempt to be resolved directly between involved members, secondly with the involvement of 1 or more consensus team members, and thirdly with pre-selected arbitration applicable for the jurisdiction as selected & agreed by involved parties and the Voluntaria consensus membership team.

4.4 Crisis Preparedness Obligations

Community Obligations:

- Organize, coordinate, and publicize preparedness workshops or training sessions for members.
- Maintain a reserve of essential supplies (e.g., food, water, medical kits) to support temporary influxes during emergencies.
- Provide clear communication channels (e.g., designated emergency hotline or app) for crisis alerts and updates.
- Designate an Emergency Response Coordinator to manage logistics and member communications during crises.

Member Obligations:

- Stay informed by participating in community drills and reviewing preparedness materials provided by the community.
- Maintain accurate and up-to-date contact information for receiving alerts or accessing community resources.

- Bring personal emergency supplies during stays, including clothing, medications, and essential documents.
- Collaborate with other members and follow the Emergency Response Coordinator's instructions during crises.

Section 5: Emergency Scenarios and Activation Conditions

In the realm of the Voluntaria Community, where preparedness is intertwined with adaptability, we present Section 5 of The Voluntaria Emergency & Retreat Access Membership Contract. This section delineates the specific emergency scenarios under which the agreement's emergency service clauses can be activated, ensuring clarity and readiness in times of crisis.

5.1 Defining Emergency Scenarios

- Broad Spectrum of Emergencies: The contract covers a range of emergency scenarios, including but not limited to natural disasters (such as earthquakes, floods, wildfires), economic collapses, pandemics threatening significant portions of the global population, nuclear events, and geopolitical instabilities like foreign invasions.
- **Criteria for Emergencies:** An emergency scenario is characterized by its widespread impact, the immediate threat to safety and well-being, and the necessity for collective action and support.

5.2 Activation Conditions

- Standard Predefined Conditions: The contract outlines specific conditions for each type of emergency, providing clear guidelines for when contract activation is appropriate.
- Voluntaria Consensus Group Agreement: In addition to the predefined conditions, contract activation may require agreement from the Voluntaria voting consensus group, ensuring community involvement in critical decisions.

5.3 Geographic-Based Activation

• Regional Specificity: Recognizing that some emergencies may be geographically localized, the contract allows for activation based on the affected regions. This ensures targeted

- support where it is most needed.
- Responsibility of Membership: Members are responsible for keeping their residency information up-to-date to facilitate geographic-based activation. Inaccurate information may affect the contract's applicability in regional emergencies.

5.4 Flexibility and Adaptability

- Unforeseen Circumstances: The contract maintains flexibility to accommodate emergencies that may not be explicitly listed but are deemed significant by the consensus group.
- Dynamic Response: The community commits to a dynamic and responsive approach, adapting its response strategies to the specific nature and demands of each emergency.

5.5 Designation of Emergency Response Coordinator

- Role and Responsibility: Outline the role of the emergency response coordinator, emphasizing their responsibility as the primary point of contact for membership during emergencies.
- **24-Hour Response Commitment**: Specify that members are entitled to a response within 24 hours for communications through the designated emergency channel.
- Official Emergency Channel: Define what constitutes the official emergency channel for communication.

5.6 Scope of Support During Emergencies

Community Support:

- Offer shelter for affected members within available capacity, prioritizing safety and equitable access.
- Provide essential resources, such as food, water, and first-aid supplies, based on availability.
- Facilitate communication and coordination between members, including access to local emergency services near community property if necessary.
- Ensure the presence of trained personnel (or designated leaders) to manage emergency operations and provide guidance.

Member Expectations:

- Follow emergency protocols established by the community, including evacuation plans and resource-sharing rules.
- Assist with basic emergency tasks, such as setting up temporary shelters, distributing supplies, or supporting vulnerable members.
- Avoid placing undue strain on community resources by bringing additional support items, such as personal emergency kits, when possible.
- Comply with decisions made by the Voluntaria Consensus Group or Emergency Response Coordinator, ensuring collective safety.

Section 6: Optional Clause for Omitting Voluntaria Consensus

In the spirit of offering choice and flexibility within the structure of our community's support system, we introduce Section 6 of The Voluntaria Emergency & Retreat Access Membership Contract. This section details the optional clause allowing membership to bypass the standard requirement of obtaining agreement from the Voluntaria voting consensus group for contract activation in emergency scenarios.

6.1 The Essence of the Optional Clause

- **Empowering Individual Choice**: Recognizing that our community members have diverse needs and preferences, this optional clause is designed for those seeking a more direct and immediate contract activation process during emergencies.
- **Bypassing Consensus Requirement**: Members opting for this clause can activate their contract based on the predefined emergency scenarios and conditions, without the need for additional community approval.

6.2 Additional Fee Structure

- Reflecting Increased Flexibility: Opting for this clause incurs an additional fee of 67% on the standard contract price. This fee accounts for the increased administrative efforts and risk management required to facilitate this option.
- **Transparent Pricing**: For example, if the standard annual membership contract is priced at \$1,500, the price with this optional clause would be approximately \$2,505.

6.3 Terms and Conditions

- **Explicit Choice at Purchase or Renewal**: Members must explicitly choose this option at the time of contract purchase or renewal. This decision is a commitment for the duration of the conract term and cannot be reversed mid-term.
- Adherence to Other Contract Terms: Opting for this clause does not exempt membership from other terms and conditions of The Voluntaria Emergency & Retreat Access Membership Contract. All other aspects of the policy remain in effect.
- Unilateral Activation with Oversight: This option allows for unilateral activation of the contract by the member, which will be subject to review by the consensus board within 7 days of activation. The consensus board must return a unanimous vote to reject the activation of the contract. In the event of rejection, the member is entitled to 3 days on the property following the rejection notification.

6.4 Renewal and Adjustment

- **Annual Review and Renewal**: The option to omit Voluntaria consensus is subject to renewal alongside the contract itself. Members can reassess their choice at each renewal period.
- **Dynamic Fee Adjustment**: The additional fee and terms for this option may be subject to adjustments based on periodic reviews, community feedback, and evolving risk assessments.

Section 7: Flexibility Clause for Unforeseen Emergencies

In the dynamic landscape of our world, where unpredictability is the only constant, we introduce Section 7 of The Voluntaria Emergency & Retreat Access Membership Contract. This section is dedicated to providing a framework for addressing unforeseen emergencies that may not be explicitly listed in the contract but are significant enough to warrant activation.

7.1 Addressing the Unpredictable

• Scope of Unforeseen Emergencies: This clause covers significant events that pose a threat to larger groups or regions, necessitating relocation to the community property for safety. It is

- designed to address emergencies that are generalized in nature, affecting many people beyond individual or personal property concerns.
- Exclusion of Personal Emergencies: While personal emergencies are important, this contract focuses on broader crises. Members facing personal emergencies are encouraged to contact the community for support, but such situations alone do not trigger contract activation.

7.2 Consent-Based Decision-Making

- Voluntaria Consensus Board/Committee: Decisions to activate the contract in response to unforeseen emergencies are made by the Voluntaria consensus board/committee, following a consent-based decision-making model. This approach ensures that the community's collective wisdom guides critical decisions.
- Confidentiality and Transparency: Votes are not public by default. However, members who submit proposals related to emergencies will be informed about the outcome, maintaining a balance between confidentiality and transparency.

7.3 Communication and Feedback Channels

- Notification Methods: Members will be notified via phone or email in the event of contract activation. A playful reminder emphasizes the importance of keeping contact information current.
- Feedback and Engagement: Channels for feedback include submitting proposals, direct contact with the community, discussions with members, and visiting the website. A private member directory with a request/accept model for contacting other members will be available, along with a dedicated email for member inquiries.

Section 8: Pricing Models

In the spirit of transparency and fairness, Section 8 of The Voluntaria Emergency & Retreat Access Membership Contract outlines the pricing models for our membership. This section is designed to offer a range of options, catering to different preferences and financial capabilities, while ensuring the sustainability and effectiveness of our community's support system.

8.1 Overview of Pricing Models

- Diverse Options for Diverse Needs: Recognizing the varied needs of our community members, we offer multiple pricing models, including lifetime, annual with renewal, and fixed-term policies.
- Discounts for Commitment: To value and encourage long-term commitment to the community, we provide discounts for policies purchased upfront for extended periods.

8.2 Detailed Pricing Structure

The following table illustrates the pricing for annual policies, starting at \$1,500 per year, with discounts ranging from 5% to 50% for upfront purchases, and a comparison column showing the full price if paid annually:

8.3 Adaptability and Review

• Dynamic Pricing: We acknowledge that circumstances and operational costs may change over time. Therefore, our pricing models are subject to periodic review and adjustment.

• Community Feedback: We are committed to considering community feedback in our pricing strategy, ensuring alignment with the members' perspectives and needs.

8.4 Pricing Adjustments and Approval Process

Transparency in Pricing Changes:

 The Voluntaria Community is committed to maintaining transparency in all pricingrelated matters. Adjustments to membership fees or optional clause charges will be communicated in advance, along with a detailed explanation of the rationale behind the changes.

• Communication of Adjustments:

- Pricing adjustments will be announced via:
 - i. **Email Notification**: All active members will receive a formal notice at least 90 days before the changes take effect.
 - ii. **Community Updates**: Pricing changes will be included in the next scheduled community meeting or update, providing an opportunity for discussion.
 - iii. **Dedicated Documentation**: Updated pricing structures will be published on the Voluntaria Community website and in supplementary materials.

• Approval by the Community:

- Proposed pricing adjustments will be reviewed by the Voluntaria Consensus Group to ensure alignment with community goals and operational needs.
- Active members will be invited to provide feedback on proposed changes during a designated 30-day review period.
- Final approval of pricing adjustments will be subject to a consensus vote within the Voluntaria Consensus Group.

Periodic Reviews:

 Pricing will be reviewed annually to account for inflation, changes in operational costs, and community feedback. Adjustments, if necessary, will be based on these reviews and communicated through the above process.

Limitation on Frequency:

• Pricing adjustments will not occur more than once annually unless extraordinary circumstances (e.g., emergency operational costs) warrant an interim review. Any such interim adjustment will require explicit consent from the Voluntaria Consensus Group.

8.5 Fee Payments and Penalties
